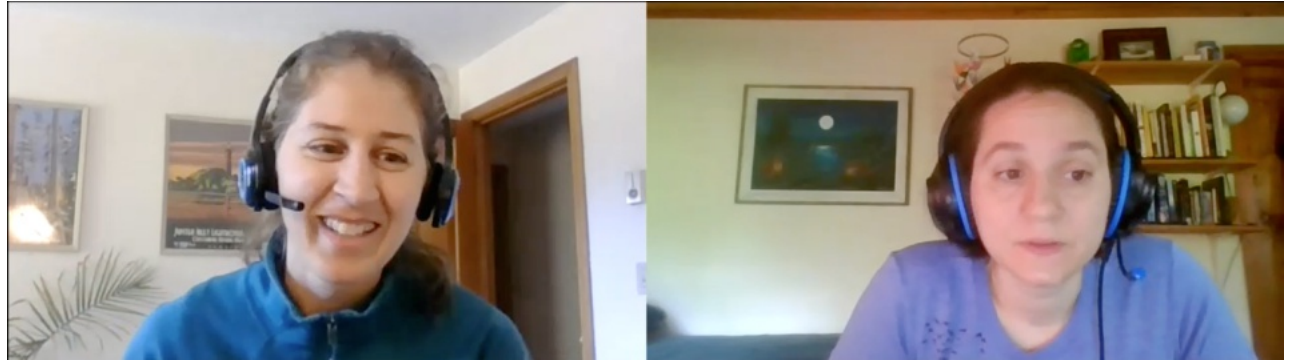
## Rodney Lynch on the Metro

Sometimes I think I hear our recently deceased senior cats, Girl Cat or BigBoi in the house. But the sounds are the wind or a squeaky door. I saw an article in online news that reported people, who have lost loved ones to Covid, claim to be able to communicate with them. I don't believe in after life communications but I can see why some people do believe.
